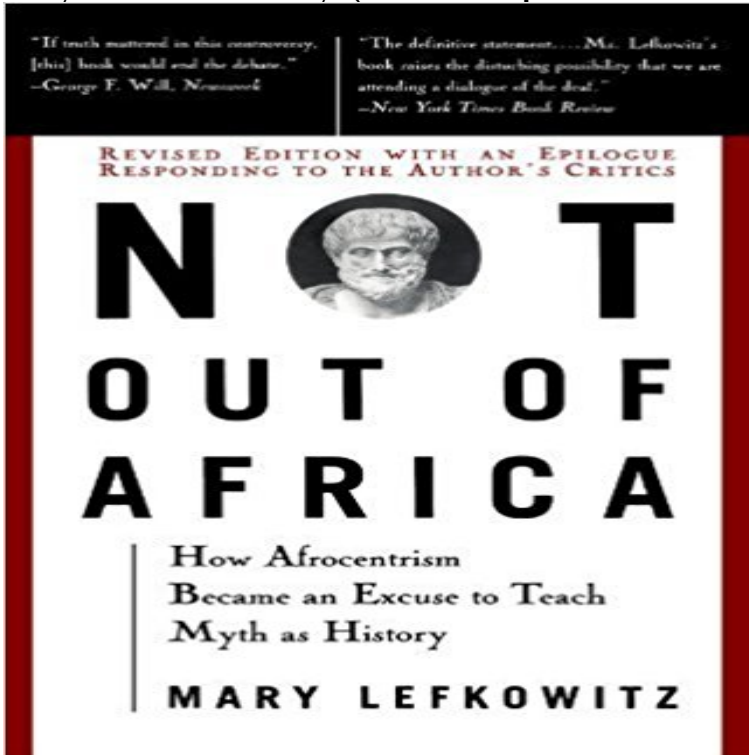


Not Out Of Africa: How Afrocentrism Became An Excuse To Teach Myth As History (New Republic Book)
