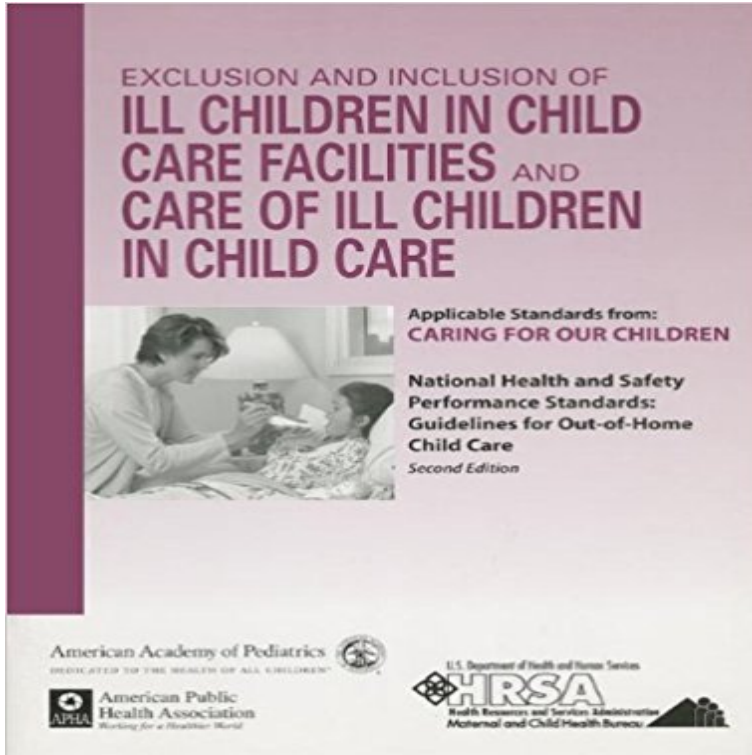


Exclusion and Inclusion of Ill Children in Child Care facilities and Care of Ill Children in Child Care
