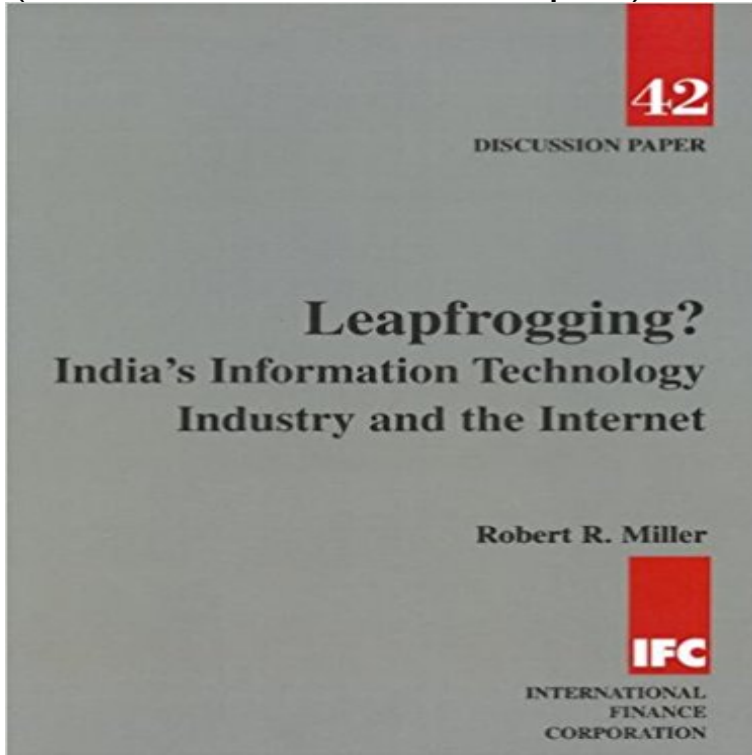


Leapfrogging? India's Information Technology Industry and the Internet (World Bank Discussion Papers)
