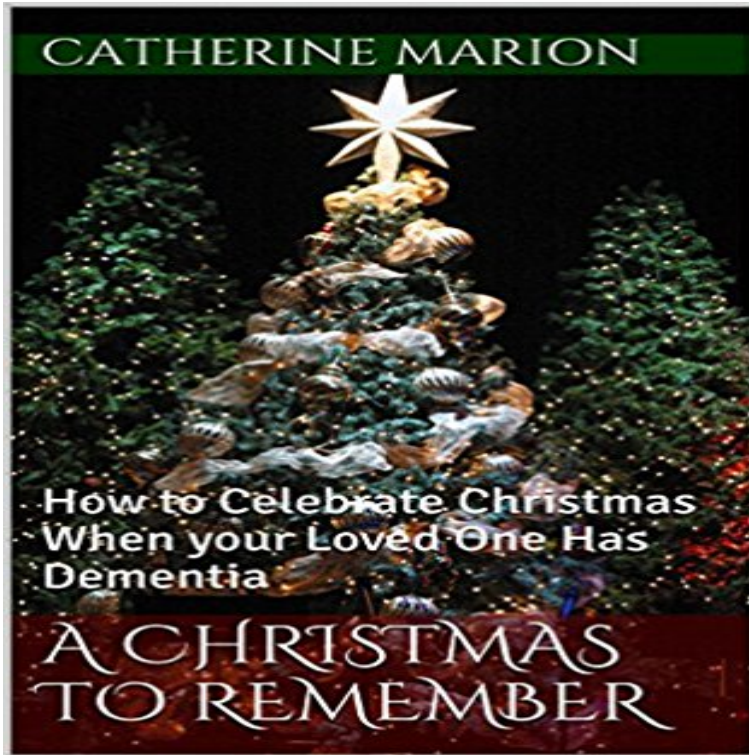


A Christmas to Remember: How to Celebrate Christmas When your Loved One Has Dementia
