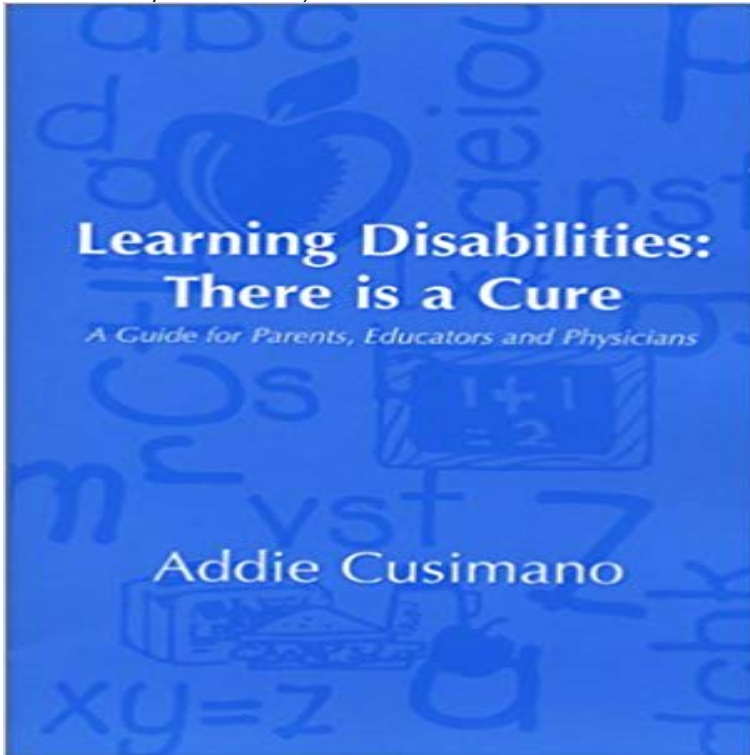


Learning Disabilities: There is a Cure--A Guide for Parents, Educators and Physicians, 1st Edition
